
Under advice and training of the Sunbow 5 foundation, we followed the no-input style of sustainable farming (Nature Cultivation). We started cultivating the land in March, then planted and harvested through October. Our focus was Japanese vegetables such as Daikon, shishito pepper, and Napa cabbage.

The rich soil of the farmland grew our vegetables and flowers more than we expected.

We learned a lot about farming practices from this pilot program. Farming activities for 2020 has closed and are now planning for 2021 programs.

We will also move to the second phase of our pilot program in 2021. In order to take steps to create a community with individuals with ASD, we will invite people with ASD to the farm and study their interests and needs.
